

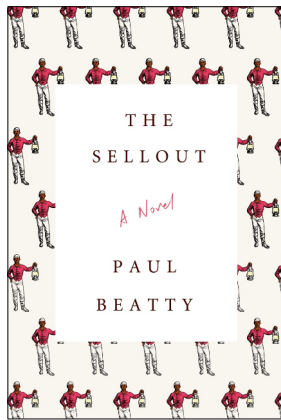


## RECOMMENDANCE Your Humor Style: **Absurd + Edgy**

**You enjoy your comedy strange, sharp, and just a little dangerous.**

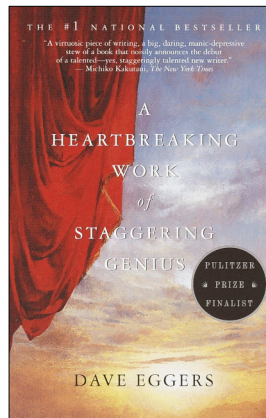

### Your Recommended Reads



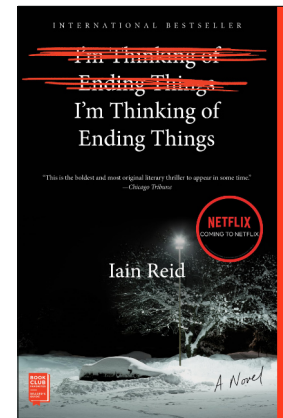
#### 1. The Sellout by Paul Beatty

A blisteringly funny, satirical novel about race, identity, and the absurdity of American life. Brilliant, provocative, and totally unafraid to cross lines.



#### 2. A Heartbreaking Work of Staggering Genius by Dave Eggers

An irreverent memoir that mixes loss, meta-commentary, and surreal humor. Daring, self-aware, and full of tonal whiplash in the best way.



#### 3. I'm Thinking of Ending Things by Iain Reid

A short, eerie novel with mounting dread and fractured reality. Darkly comic in places, it pairs absurdity with psychological intensity.

#### Core Traits:

- **Absurdity:** Surreal plots, illogical turns, playful unreality
- **Edginess:** Discomfort, confrontation, emotional provocation

#### Look For:

- Satire with strange setups
- Dark comedy that leans surreal
- Writers unafraid to get weird and uncomfortable

#### Probably *Not* for You

**Avoid: Eleanor Oliphant Is Completely Fine by Gail Honeyman**

Though quirky, it leans into sentiment and emotional resolution. If you prefer your humor more biting and unpredictable, this may feel too gentle.

#### If This Is You, You Might Say:

"I like my comedy wild, but with sharp edges."

#### A Note on Culture

*Humor doesn't exist in a vacuum – it's shaped by the places we've lived, the languages we speak, and the cultures we carry with us. Uncoverize's humor styles aim to describe how people laugh, but not always why.
