
RECOMMENDANCE Your Humor Style: Clever + Edgy

Your Recommended Reads




1. Lucky Jim by Kingsley Amis

- Edginess: Dark comedy, rulebreaking, emotional risk



2. The Ask by Sam Lipsyte

Modern, brutal, and smart. A failing development officer at a university lurches through awkward conversations and existential breakdowns with deadpan brilliance and acidic bite.

- Satirical voices
- Sardonic narrators
