


1. Where'd You Go, Bernadette by Maria Semple

- Cleverness: Verbal wit, irony, and observational insight




2. Me Talk Pretty One Day by David Sedaris

3. Less by Andrew Sean Greer

A neurotic writer flees his ex's wedding by saying yes to every literary invitation he receives around the globe. Gently satirical, quietly poignant, and consistently clever.

Probably Not for You

Avoid: A Confederacy of Dunces by John Kennedy Toole

While revered in some circles, its over-the-top absurdity and larger-than-life protagonist may feel too chaotic or cartoonish if you prefer grounded, recognizable characters.

"I love it when a book makes me laugh because I've been there."
