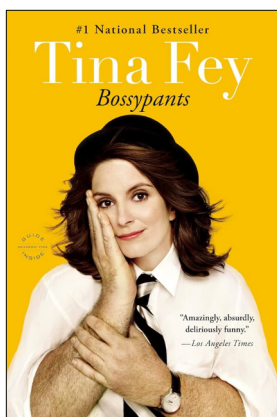


## **RECOMMENDANCE** Your Humor Style: **Physical + Relatable**

**You laugh at life's mishaps—especially when they get a little messy.**

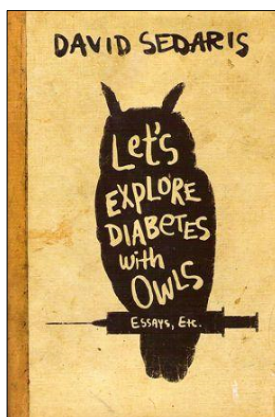

#### 1. **Bossypants** by Tina Fey

A brilliant mix of behind-the-scenes stories, social awkwardness, and physical self-deprecation. Fey brings intellect and pratfalls together in totally relatable ways.



#### 2. **Let's Explore Diabetes with Owls** by David Sedaris

A collection of essays full of everyday mishaps and social blunders, often taken to bodily extremes. Laugh-out-loud funny and painfully human.



#### 3. **Dear Girls** by Ali Wong

Unfiltered advice and wildly funny stories told through letters to her daughters. Full of energy, honesty, and physical humour rooted in real experience.

#### Core Traits:

- **Physicality:** Embodied humour, mishaps, movement
- **Relatability:** Everyday life, awkward truths, human moments

#### Look For:

- Stories with comic momentum
- Characters who stumble (sometimes literally)
- Writers who turn real-life mess into comedy gold

#### Avoid: **The Secret Diary of Adrian Mole, Aged 13¾** by Sue Townsend

Though beloved, its humour leans more satirical and character-based than physical. If you crave momentum and motion, it might feel too still.

#### If This Is You, You Might Say:

"I've lived this. I've fallen over during this."

#### A Note on Culture
